



PAPER SNOWFLAKES

We have cold weather, nights that last all day, and lots of snow in the Arctic Circle. Did you know that no two snowflakes look the same? Just like you are a completely unique individual, a snowflake has a one-of-a-kind size and characteristics. Let's make different snowflakes to decorate the house!

Materials

- Scissors
- White construction paper

Instructions

Start with a square piece of paper. Fold the paper in half diagonally to make a triangle. Fold the paper triangle in half again so that the pointed corners meet. Now, fold the paper triangle into thirds, overlapping the left pointed corner over the triangle. Overlap the right pointed corner over the triangle. You may need to adjust these folds a little to get the sides to match up, so don't crease the paper until the folds are just right! Now, trim the pointed ends. Finally, cut your folded paper with different variations of cutouts.



TIP: The ones with straight lines are easier to make than the ones with curvy lines.) Unfold it gently. Don't worry if your snowflake isn't exact or perfect! No two snowflakes are ever alike.
